Landscape-ecological research, especially the study and protection of biological, landscape diversity, is a priority direction for rational nature conservation of Georgia and in the protection case. Without these studies, sustainable development of the area is impossible. Georgia has a unique natural environment. For Georgia development of recreational resources has not only, economic, but also social significance.
